Adapt your knowledge of Hispanic cuisine to Peruvian dishes! Terry’s Market an excellent place to shop.



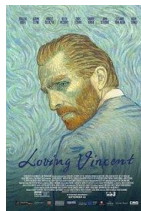
### **Dec. 15—Turkey**

### **Sept. 22— film “He Even Has Your Eyes”**

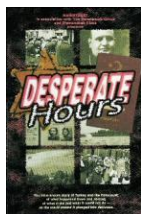
(France) When French-African couple Paul and Sali discover the longed-for baby they are about to adopt is white, family chaos and confrontation ensue.
